When Governor Stitt indicated last week that some businesses and churches could re-open effective May 1, our Oklahoma Bishop Jimmy Nunn said to our clergy . . . "Not so fast." Bishop Nunn has not given permission to any of our Oklahoma Methodist churches to re-open just yet.

We are to continue with the suspension of public worship, to keep groups of people in the church to less than 10 at any one time, and to continue with social distancing, sheltering at home, and live-streaming of worship services. We are still prohibited from conducting public funerals. In other words, we are to maintain our new normal throughout the month of May. Bishop Nunn will issue his next updated ruling on May 17.

So, you are invited to continue watching our virtual worship being live-streamed and archived on our church's face book page, or watch it on YouTube. I also provide a "Mid-Week Meditation" that is posted to our face book page on Wednesdays.

Additionally, I have been sending out via email a "Monday Morning Missal" that includes updates and our latest Prayer List.

This will all be set aside someday and be a part of our collective history . . . but for now, let us maintain our current course of separation and yet together in our resurrected Lord Jesus Christ. He is risen indeed!

FROM OUR ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL MEETING APRIL 26

We held our quarterly Administrative Council meeting last Sunday by means of ZOOM, which is a digitized version of meeting separately but yet simultaneously via computerized video. For our first-time effort, I thought it went quite well.

Teresa Scott gave her report on behalf of the Finance Committee. In short, we are maintaining ourselves under our current structure. Your stewardship financial giving has been absolutely amazing as you've shared your gifts via the USPS. Teresa thanks everyone for their continued faithfulness in honoring their pledges to the church.

We had one item of business that required a virtual vote: The Conference is requiring every local UMC to create re-launch teams so that we are properly prepared to re-open and resume public worship and other activities when the time comes. Specific directions from the Conference indicated that the teams should be no more than eight persons in number, and also specified the positions that should be represented on each re-launch team.

Our Re-launch Teams will be as follows . . .

"Re-Open Team"—Pastor, Administrative Council chairperson (Stan Buss), Lay Leader/Delegate (David Freno), Trustees chairperson (Frances Birdsong), Worship Committee (Chris Moore), Medical Person/Parish Nurse (Kathy Bray)

"Economic Impact Team"—Finance chairperson (Teresa Scott), Treasurer (Donna Alexander), Financial Secretary (Barbara Zapf), Pastor/Administrative Assistant (Jo Ellen Reed), Margo Hirschman (VIM Committee chairperson), Gail Montgomery (SPPRC chairperson).

Motion was made by the pastor that the Administrative Council give decision-making authority to the "Re-Open Team" and "Economic Impact Team" regarding details of re-launching the church whenever the Bishop gives permission. Motion was seconded by Teresa Scott. Motion carried unanimously.

SANITIZING THE CHURCH BUILDING

Our church custodian, Yalonda King, has been deep-cleaning portions of the church building that might represent a health hazard once we return to worship. She has been shampooing all carpeted areas downstairs, including the Fellowship Hall, office areas, and the Sanctuary. She has used Murphy's Wood Soap to scrub all the wooden pews. Upstairs in the classrooms currently being utilized, Yalonda has wiped down all tables and chairs with disinfectant.

SANITATION STATIONS

The pastor will be creating "Sanitation Stations" at specific locations around the church building for once we return to public worship.

Each station will contain hand sanitizer, disinfectant wet wipes (if we can purchase them), and a supply of cloth masks.

There will be Sanitation Station close to the Main Entrance, the Sanctuary, and the East Entrance by the Fellowship Hall/Home Builders classroom.
